Siri

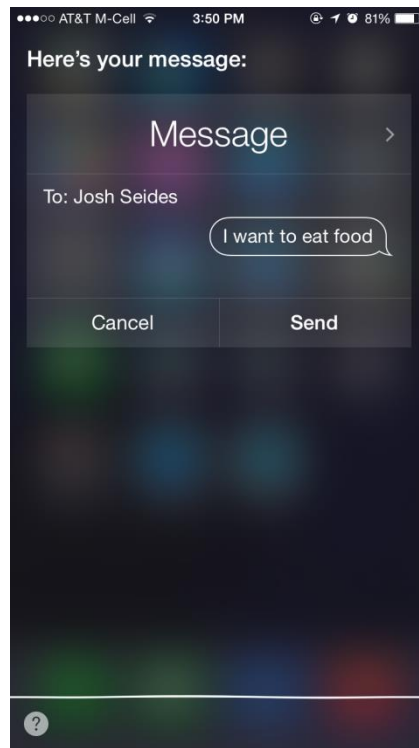
One unique feature of iPhones is the inclusion of Siri, a program which you can talk to through your phone. Siri has many useful purposes. You can call people, text them, email them, look up directions, and even get Siri to give you your own personal nickname.

1. To use Siri, simply press and hold the HOME button on your iPhone. When you do this, a sound (high-pitched) will go off which indicates that your phone is ready to be talked to.



2. Once the sound goes off, you can say just about anything you want. You can say, “Call Bob” or “Tell Jim that I’m on my way.” Once you do, a slightly different

sound will go off and you will know that Siri is processing your voice. It will also show on the screen what you just said.



3. The benefit of Siri is that is very user-friendly and simple to use. Once you are accustomed to how to use Siri on a basic level, you can use it for just about anything you need. Here is a list of commands in which you can use Siri:

- Call [Insert Name]
- Tell [Insert Name] that [Insert Phrase]
- What song is this? (Allow Siri to listen)
- How do I get to [Insert Location]
- From now on, call me [Insert Nickname]
- Do I have any voicemails?
- FaceTime [Insert Name]
- Where is [Insert Name] (must have “Find my iPhone” enabled)

- Schedule a meeting with [Insert Name] tomorrow at 5:00
- Remind me to [Insert Action] at 6:00 tomorrow night
- Set an alarm for 7:30 tomorrow morning
- What's the weather like today?
- Assorted math questions (what's 2 plus 2, etc.)
- Settings ("turn off Wi-Fi," "turn the brightness down," etc.)

The list above shows just a few of hundreds of commands Siri is capable of responding to. All of these are available with just a click of a button and your voice. So use your words! This is so simple for people who have trouble typing on the iPhone. Use this to do actions on your phone that otherwise might be hard or inconvenient to do.
